As an Assistant Professor of Social Work (Tenure Track) at the University of Regina, Saskatchewan, Festus provides research contributions across the social sector. He is currently the Co-Investigator and Collaborator on research exploring Older Racialized Immigrants' Social Connectedness: Impacts of the Living Environment and the Impact of COVID-19 on the mental well-being of new immigrants in Southern Ontario. Festus is a frequently requested key-note lecturer, podcast guest, and conference panelist where he has provided expertise across the social work profession. Festus holds a Doctor of Philosophy in Social Work from Wilfrid Laurier University, a Master of Philosophy in Social Work from the University of Ghana, and a Bachelor of Arts in Social Work with Political Science from the University of Ghana.

Festus has co-authored numerous peer reviewed articles including The Typologies of Mental Health, Addiction, and Problem Gambling Systems Integration in Ontario and The power of the tongue: Inherent labeling of persons with disabilities in proverbs of the Akan people of Ghana.

Festus's commitment to excellence earned him the Award for Outstanding Graduate Work (PhD) from Wilfrid Laurier University (2020), as well as a nomination for the PhD Gold Award (2019).
